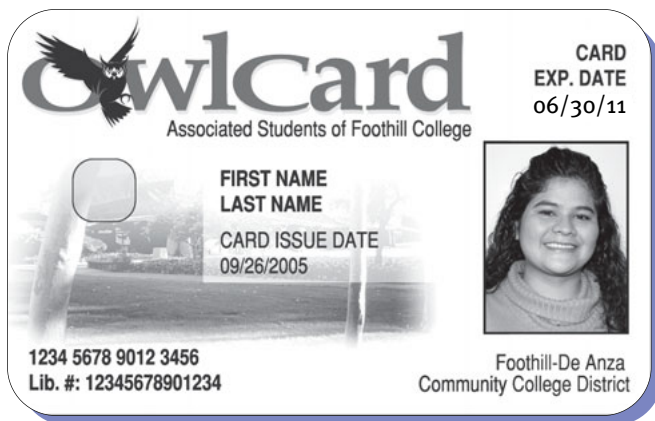


Be Smart—Your Student ID Is Where It Starts!



Officially, it's called the Associated Students of Foothill College (ASFC) Student Body Identification Card, but we call it the OwlCard. It's yours when you pay basic registration fees. The OwlCard supports and makes campus services possible. Use it wherever student ID is required. Your OwlCard has a computer chip that allows you to make purchases from the ASFC Smart Shop, and select copy machines and print stations. You may also use your card to check out books from the campus library or videos from the Media Center.

Be sure to also show your OwlCard to get free admission to Foothill College Hour and Heritage Month events. You can also use your OwlCard to buy discounted movie tickets, get discounted admission to Foothill athletic and performing arts events, food and cafe, receive special deals at local restaurants and stores, and get free psychological services advice, and receive free legal counseling. It's the card that gives you emergency loans, campus event discounts, and funds a variety of cultural and social campus activities. How to Get Your OwlCard

- 1) Pay your student body fees at registration;
- 2) Go to the ASFC Smart Shop or Middlefield Campus Student Resource Center in the Hub with your registration receipt, photo ID and completed OwlCard application;
- 3) Have your photo taken in the ASFC Smart Shop;
- 4) Your new card will be processed while you wait; and
- 5) You must pay your fees to have your OwlCard validated every quarter.

Arne Duncan, U.S. Secretary of Education & Foothill 2010 Commencement Speaker

Arne Duncan has been known to tear it up on the basketball court with his pals. In fact, his current boss, President Barack Obama, jokes that his longtime friend has the superior jump shot. Duncan, who co-captained the Harvard basketball team and played professionally in Australia before beginning his education career, has enjoyed a career that has taken him to the nation's top education post: Secretary of the United States Department of Education. Prior to his appointment as secretary of education, Duncan served as the chief executive officer of the Chicago Public Schools (CPS), from 2001 through 2008, becoming the longest-serving big-city education superintendent in the country. Among his most significant accomplishments during his tenure as CEO, an all-time high of 66.7 percent of the district's elementary school students met or exceeded state reading standards, and their math scores reached a record high, with 70.6 percent meeting or exceeding the state's standards. At high schools, CPS students posted gains on the ACT at three times the rate of national gains and nearly twice that of the state.

In his confirmation hearings, Duncan called education "the most pressing issue facing America," adding that "preparing young people for success in life is not just a moral obligation of society" but also an "economic imperative." Duncan expressed his commitment to work under the leadership of President Obama and with all those involved in education "to enhance education in America, to lift our children and families out of poverty, to help our students learn to contribute to the civility of our great American democracy, and to strengthen our economy by producing a workforce that can make us as competitive as possible."

Of Duncan, President Obama has said, "In the next few years, the decisions we make about how to educate our children will shape our future for generations. When it comes to school reform, Arne is the most hands-on of hands-on practitioners. For Arne, school reform isn't just a theory in a book—it's the cause of his life. And the results aren't just about test scores or statistics, but about whether our children are developing the skills they need to compete with any worker in the world for any job."
