Located 115 miles south of San Francisco and 350 miles north of Los Angeles, Monterey offers an excellent quality of life and unparalleled beauty. The city features a dazzling waterfront along the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary, a lush urban forest, a rich array of historic and cultural resources, museums, gardens, and more!

Monterey Bay Aquarium

Monterey is the home of the world-class Monterey Bay Aquarium, which is one of the largest and most respected aquariums in the world. It has an annual attendance of 1.8 million and holds 35,000 plants and animals representing 623 species, including stingrays, jellyfish, sea turtles, sharks, penguins, and sea otters. *Now there is even a great white shark for a limited time!* The Monterey Bay Aquarium also supports and conducts conservation research programs.

Cannery Row

Cannery Row is the waterfront street in the New Monterey section of Monterey, site of many sardine canning factories that collapsed in the mid-1950s. Today the area around Cannery Row is a marine sanctuary and is home to a large resurgent population of California sea lions.

Cannery Row was the setting of John Steinbeck's novels Cannery Row (1945) and Sweet Thursday (1954). Both were the basis for the 1982 movie Cannery Row. It is also mentioned in Bob Dylan's song Sad Eyed Lady of the Lowlands.



CARMEL-BY-THE-SEA

Carmel-by-the-Sea, Carmel in short, has consistently been voted one of the top tourist and visitor destinations in the country and you have to see it to believe it. Carmel is located on a breathtaking white sand beach and the quaint European style village offers romance, gourmet dining, shopping and fun.
