- ❖ COR Technical Review Pilot: As part of CCC's ongoing effort to speed up and streamline our curriculum process, the CCC Team has proposed a pilot for a Technical Review team to review CORs early in the C3MS process, simultaneously with Articulation Office review. Initially, the CCC Team will conduct the Technical Review and will begin reviewing CORs shortly—if you currently have a COR in Articulation status or submit a COR in the near future, you may be contacted with questions. - ❖ Evaluating Curriculum through an Equity Lens: At the November 14th CCC meeting, Carolyn Holcroft presented on the topic of equity, specific to curriculum at the course level. The presentation included suggestions for faculty to implement when creating a COR, preparing materials for a course, and engaging with students in the classroom. - Guided Pathways Model: Also at the November 14th CCC meeting, Rachelle Campbell shared out

information from the Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative (IEPI) training on November 7th, about the Guided Pathways Model. This is not a new initiative, but a shift in mindset on how to align the student experience. The goal is to create clear curricular pathways, help students choose and enter their pathway and stay on their path, and ensure that learning is happening with intentional outcomes. The first step is for Foothill to submit a self-assessment in December, followed by an 18-month plan in March.
