- ❖ **Reevaluating Seat Counts:** At the February 18th meeting, CCC continued discussion on the topic of seat counts, aided by a presentation from Anthropology faculty member Kathryn Maurer. Kathryn's presentation outlined the current issues regarding seat counts at Foothill and how such issues tie in to inequities and inconsistencies for both faculty and students. Consensus among the group was that this is a complex and challenging issue that needs to be addressed, but further discussions will need to occur to determine where to begin, and how.
