- ❖ New Degree or Certificate (Program) Creation Process: At the May 31st meeting, CCC held a first read of a new formal process to be used by faculty/departments to create a new degree or certificate (to replace the "temporary" process we've been using since 2019). The proposed process was drafted by a workgroup led by Eric, and it includes the introduction of a short New Degree or Certificate Proposal form, which the faculty/department completes at the very beginning of the process while simultaneously engaging in
 - discussions with relevant people (e.g., department faculty, dean(s), AVP of Workforce). The purpose of this new form and the focus of these discussions is to gauge the feasibility of the degree/certificate as early as possible. CCC engaged in a lengthy discussion about the proposed process, touching on the importance of ensuring the necessary resources will be available for any new degree/certificate, and considering the possibility of using an abbreviated process for new non-transcriptable certificates (which are not submitted to the state). This is a very important topic, and we urge all faculty to take a few moments and review the proposed process—your CCC Reps can forward it to you. If you have any feedback, questions, or
- Equity in the COR: At the May 31st meeting, CCC continued discussing the high-priority topic of ensuring equity is incorporated into Foothill course outlines of record (CORs) by holding our second round of breakout groups—this time, the Course Content section was the focus. Following 20 minutes of discussion in small groups, folks shared out ideas, including: (for STEM courses, in particular) engaging in discussion of how science is evolving/iterative, to evaluate timeliness of the Course Content information; (for English courses, etc.) considering adding non-"canonical" texts, to help ensure inclusion of diverse perspectives. Additionally, some folks pointed out that for courses in certain disciplines (e.g., Allied Health departments) faculty don't have much freedom in what they may include in the Course Content.
