



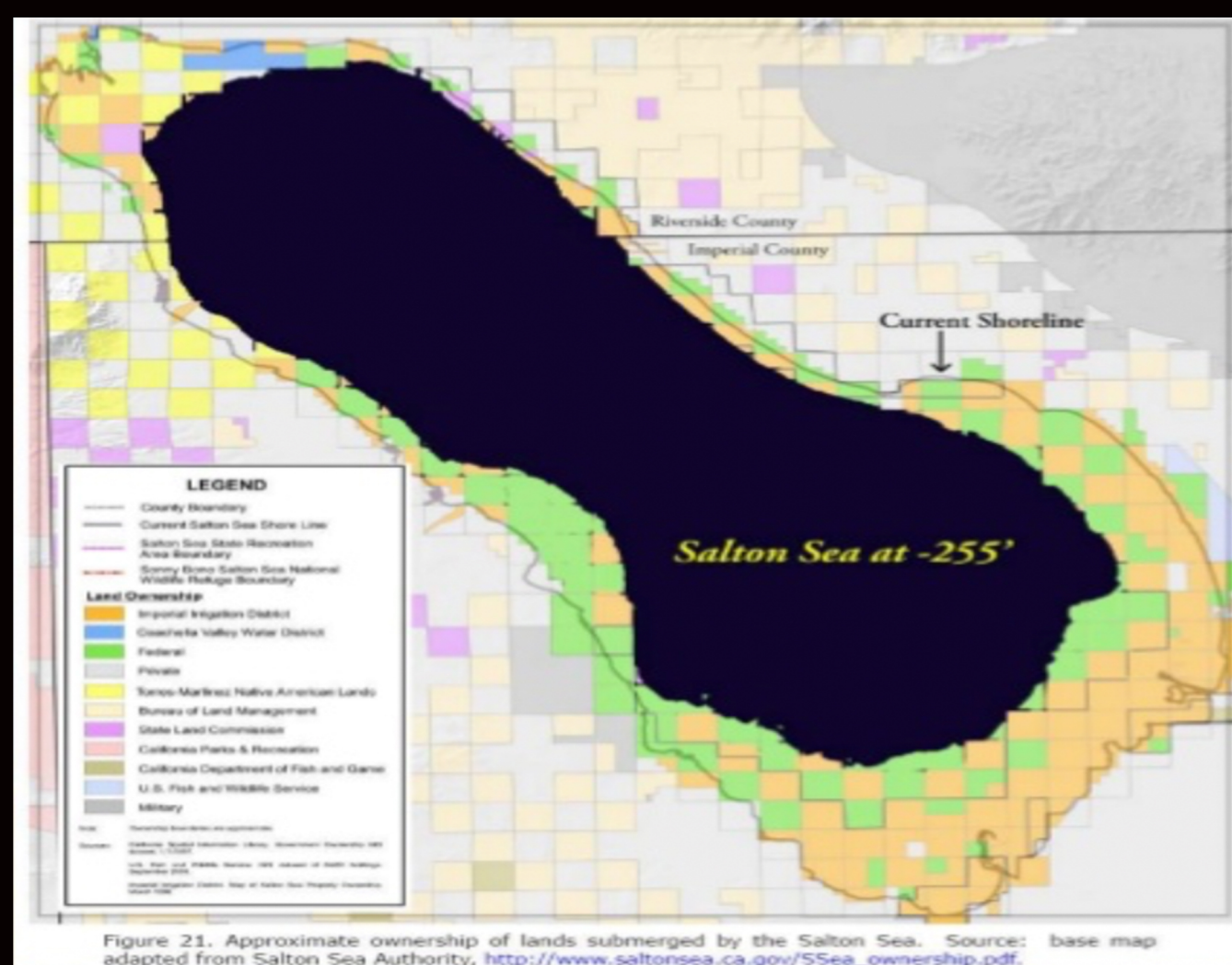
Salton Sea

The Salton Sea is the largest lake in California and is **RAPIDLY DECREASING**. The sea is a terminal lake with no outflow, inflow was cut off in 2017. In 1905, water from the Colorado River flooded the salton basin in result of a broken levy.
