

The REPLAY version of Black Minds Matter begins on October 8, 2018. CCEAL has turned the course into a professional development curriculum for educators. The course has ten sessions that each includes an edited video from the first Black Minds Matter course (from Fall of 2018), discussion questions for participating sites, and activities for each week. If you missed the series last year, Black Minds Matter addresses the experiences and realities of Black boys and men in education. The course draws parallels between the Black Lives Matter movement and the ways that Black minds are engaged in the classroom. The course offers numerous strategies for improving the learning, development, and success of Black male students (from preschool through doctoral).

Participants will simply gather **in the President's Conference Room** to watch the edited videos and work through the discussion questions together. **ALL are welcome** – staff, students, administrators and faculty!
