		The Governance Redesign Leadership Council, made up of faculty, classified staff,
		students, and administrators, has held a series of meetings to discuss various
		governance models and will provide an opportunity to update the college
		community on it's efforts, and hear feedback. This Wednesday (February 28th) from

1:30-2:30pm in the President's Conference Room, there will be a Town Hall shareout of the Leadership Council's efforts.

Here are some of the latest discussion points amongst the Leadership Council at last week's PaRC meeting:

Role of Governance

- 1. Plan
- 2. Allocation of resources (implementation)
- 3. Evaluate/review/assess effectiveness
- 4. RePlan Examine what needs to be changed in our plan

Education Master Plan Model currently under consideration:

"PARC "(overarching committee, with a different name)

Subcommittees:

- 1) Equity/Education
- 2) Community
- 3) Resources

Examples of topics to be covered under each of these committees (not an exhaustive list)

PARC – Strategic Objectives, Planning, Resource Allocation, Accreditation, Program Approval and Discontinuance

- **1) Equity/Education**: Instruction, Equity, Basic Skills, Program Review, 3SP, Workforce, Transfer, Assessment, Online Enrollment, Dual Enrollment
- **2) Community/Institutional Effectiveness**: Professional Development, Workforce, Service Leadership, Institutional Learning Outcomes, Alumni, Governance, Communication
- **3) Resources/Sustainability**: OPC/Budget, Technology, Sustainability, Facilities, Buildings and Grounds

Committee Operations:

- *Each committee would have 12 members 3 faculty, 3 classified staff, 3 students, and 3 administrators
- *Each committee would be assigned a recorder
- *Each committee would be assigned ex-officio members to support the work of the committee
- *Every committee recommendation would be in a memo in writing. President writes back to the committee
- *Committees would have a trained facilitator assigned

Proposed meeting times for the above committees on Fridays. Fridays may be when most faculty/staff/administrators will be available.

Commentary:

- *The work of these committees requires faculty members to put on many hats within each committee, and take on a plethora of responsibilities that may take away too much time from teaching
- *The timing of these committee meetings will take away whole subsets (i.e. faculty

		members who have school-age children with activities in the middle of the day) *The three faculty on these committees will gain the most powerful voice, due to the responsibility of reading and synthesizing the material. Is this shared governance? *Walk-through scenario: Faculty leaders bring forth that there is a new initiative from the State that we need to address. Faculty and Administrative leaders can identify the (let's say Math and English) professors that will be taking on the minutiae of implementing this initiative. The shared governance committees would not be responsible for the nitty-gritty of implementing the initiative, but would instead identify that it is important and verify the individuals that would be tasked with this work. Escoto asked senate reps to share governance redesign updates with their constituents, and provide feedback.
