Re: Program Review – Green, Yellow, Red Designations

In light of the new governance structure and PaRC's deferral of the final recommendation on the programs under comprehensive program reviews, I write to provide you with my leanings in response to the Program Review Committee's recommendations.

I will try my best not to express my leanings in the future, though this special circumstance as aforementioned leads me to think that it would be more helpful to colleagues currently under program review to prepare for the upcoming academic year. Programs that receive a red or yellow designation are required to write another comprehensive program review. The new Governance Council will not meet until October 5 – leaving a shorter time period to complete a comprehensive program review by December.

GREEN DESIGNATION:

Last Spring Quarter, the Program Review Committee recommended the following programs receive a green designation, and PaRC agreed. I lean toward agreeing with the green designation, and thus, these programs are not required to complete a comprehensive program review this year.

LIST OF GREEN: Anthropology, Assessment Center, Library, Business, Philosophy, Counseling, Physics, Psych Services, Puente, Student Affairs, TLC, and Physics

RED DESIGNATION:

Last Spring Quarter, the Program Review Committee recommended the following programs receive a red designation, and PaRC agreed. I lean toward agreeing with the red designation,

and thus, these programs are required to complete a comprehensive program review this year and present to the Governance Council in January/February 2019.

LIST OF RED: Theater, Spanish, and Nano Tech

YELLOW DESIGNATION:

Last Spring Quarter, the Program Review Committee recommended the following programs receive a yellow designation, and PaRC was not able to conduct a final vote on that matter and deferred the matter to the new governance committee.

I lean toward agreeing with the yellow designation, except for two programs: rad tech and dental hygiene. After review, I have determined that a green rating is more appropriate for those programs. All programs with a yellow designation are required to complete a comprehensive program review this year and present to the Governance Council in January/February 2019.

LIST OF YELLOW: Chemistry, Art History, Dental Hygiene (GREEN), Respiratory Therapy, Pharm Tech, Music Tech, Athletic Injury Care, Personal Training, Engineering, Geography, GIST, and Rad Tech (GREEN).
