- PRC commends the program for its work to involve a diverse group of students in leadership activities.
- PRC commends the program, its faculty and staff for increasing student participation in campus life.

- PRC commends the program for its efficient and effective handling of student grievances.

SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT:

- PRC suggests that the program delineate the resources and personnel supporting the various functions of the office (perhaps through a functional organization chart) to better understand and articulate the needs of the office.
 PRC noted that the request for a full time position was not linked to the departmental analysis of needs
- PRC suggests that the program continue to assess its marketing efforts for late start classes and share the results with others across the campus.

- PRC suggests the program assess the student activity needs at Sunnyvale Center and work with others on campus to provide activities to support students at Sunnyvale.
- PRC suggests the program consider student activities for online students, including service learning opportunities.
