The Sustainability Management Plan was last revised April 19, 2018 and approved by the main college governance body. Reporting to the American Association of Sustainability (AASHE) and updating the Sustainability Report should occur every two years. AASHE is due now and the Sustainability Plan could be revised next year.

While this plan is not required for any particular body, having an outdated plan may be seen as a miss by taxpayers, accreditors, and AASHE. Note that the Sustainability Plan currently informs the Facilities Master Plan.

Bob Cormia, Jim Kozelka, and Julie Ceballos have been involved with the Sustainability Plan and could continue their engagement. Other participants are no longer as active or with the college.
