Generated Outcomes/Solutions Summit on Student Homelessness June 14, 2019

Highest-rated recommendations compiled from the lists generated by the working groups.

- -Items in red are the highest ranked items from brainstorming sessions.
- -Items in blue were generated by the broader conversation on the ranked items.

Short Term Solutions

- 1. 24-hour study area open to students
- 2. Not towing or ticketing students sleeping in their cars overnight
 - a. RV lot/camping/parking for vehicle dwelling students
 - b. Utilize existing solar panels to power students' devices, provide heat, etc
- 3. Market big companies for help with funding, and any other assistance they can provide
- 4. Increase marketing for existing services to make them more available to students
 - a. Use app to assess student needs (Cisco aided "Footsie" app) designed to let students know about available resources
- 5. Have CalFresh/EBT Cards accepted by on-campus dining services (currently in progress)
- 6. Include and advertise services on all faculty syllabi
- 7. Professional Development Training for Faculty, educating them on homelessness and how to support homeless students
- 8. Redesign a portion of the college's website to include links to resources
- 9. Collaborate with local charities for any possible support
- 10. On-campus laundry facilities
- 11. Create an LGBTQ safe space on campus
 - a. Promote awareness of issues faced by and outreach to the LGBTQ community
- 12. Centralized homelessness services to prevent students from needing to search on their own
- 13. Create a Homeless Liaison; a staff position to help direct students to services
- 14. Work with county shelters to save a portion of their beds specifically for students
- 15. Open gymnasium for overnight shelter, especially in extreme weather
- 16. Use any vacant space to house students, having bunks with work study positions for students to provide supervision
- 17. Place students in local housing, sharing housing with Los Altos/Los Altos Hills residents
 - a. Consider the Host Family Model for homeless students
- 18. Continue to expand the college's Food Pantry
- 19. Ensure Veterans Resource Center has well-established pathways to homelessness resource
- 20. Connect faculty, especially part-time, with the resources, as part-time faculty are often housing-insecure

Long Term Solutions

- 1) Build student housing through bonds, taxes, city and county approval
 - a. Fundraising events for housing funds
 - b. Fundraising from nonprofits; let them hear from the students
 - c. Decide whether housing will be student housing or transitional housing, as we offer 2 year degrees
 - d. Look at other community colleges with dorms for examples (Reedley, Shasta, Sierra College)
 - e. Decide if housing would be only need based
 - f. Joe Simitian may be able to help with zoning for housing
 - g. Consider what we are willing to do when we get negative community feedback
- 2) Destigmatize homelessness, through marketing and other events
 - a. Foothill College mind shift; make housing part of our initial inquiry with new students
- 3) Build employer/landlord relationships with the college, provide incentives for renting to students
 - a. Mailers to the surrounding communities to promote housing students
 - b. Build partnerships with local companies for mutual benefits
- 4) Build Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) in nearby cities
- 5) Fine landlords for having vacant buildings
- 6) Expand Financial Aid
 - a. Support Senate Bill 291
 - b. Expand EOPS
- 7) Include homeless community college students in housing provide by County Measure A
 - a. Pitch to Santa Clara County for students to live in Measure A units
- 8) Working with other community colleges to allow easier moves for community college students at all campuses
- 9) Day care for student parents
 - a. Create an on-campus child care center
- 10) Form a Bay Area Housing consortium
- 11) Talk with other colleges who are working on the issue of homelessness
- 12) Fundamentally rethinking what a community college is, and who they serve
