



Developing a Collective Awareness: Maritime & Urban Concerns Exhibition

Christine Hanlon has been awarded Best in Show for Death of an Oil Tanker: Prestige 1976-2002 at the Coos Art Museum's 15th Annual Maritime Exhibit. This painting is an oil-on-panel triptych, which was inspired by the devastating oil tanker disaster that occurred off the coast of Spain and Portugal in 2002. This maritime disaster, which devastated the fishing industry and ecology of the Spanish coast, is one of several such incidents that have become the focus of Hanlon's oil painting. The world's dependence upon oil and its effect upon the marine environment, along with her love of the sea and ocean-going vessels, are the reasons that cargo ships, fishing boats, tugboats, and oil tankers have become subjects of interest for Hanlon. She lives near Half Moon Bay in Northern California and routinely paints plain air watercolors of Maverick's Beach near Pillar Point Harbor.
