The EOPS office reported 313 students participating in the EOPS program in Fall 2019. Of these students, 275 (88%) have enrolled in Winter 2020 as of January 9, 2020.


Table 1 below shows the total count of Fall 2019 EOPS students in each ethnicity group, the number who have enrolled in Winter 2020, and the number who have not yet enrolled in Winter 2020. Most EOPS students who have not yet enrolled are Latinx (23 students, 61%), followed by Asian students (7, 18%) and African-American students (4, 11%).

Figure 1 below illustrates, for each ethnicity group, the percent of students not yet enrolled in Winter 2020. Overall, 12% of students are not yet enrolled in Winter 2020. The student groups with the largest percent of students not yet enrolled are Filipinx (25%, 1 student), African-American (16%, 4 students), and students who declined to state their ethnicity (25%, 1 student).

Methodology: EOPS students for Fall 2019 were identified by the EOPS office. These students' CWIDs were then joined to the ODS table Reg_Analysis to look for Winter 2020 enrollment (of any kind). Ethnicity information was pulled from the ODS table Ethnicity_Detail.
