Santa Clara County is still overseeing vaccinations and their **COVID-19 Vaccination** page has links to all healthcare providers' sites.



Governance Updates

R&R Council

At its 3/5 meeting, the R&R council had a preliminary discussion on funding the Japanese Cultural Center & Azumaya and the Observatory projects. The council approved to fund equity initiatives using one-time carryover B budget fund for a minimum of 3 years with an opportunity to reassess at some point. The amounts will be determined later. The council also agrees that we should only proceed once the funding and process have been determined.



C&C, R&R, and AC all met today to discuss everything from service leadership and equity initiative funding to the the college's core values and our institutional set standards. We'll publish full reports in next week's Parliament.

Registration will open soon. Here is the <u>link</u> for more information. As there will be no registration fee, would encourage those interested to register as soon as it opens.



Dr. Elinor Gates to Speak at Astronomy Lecture Series



Dr. Elinor Gates, staff astronomer at the Lick Observatory, will speak on March 10 at 7 p.m. as part of the Silicon Valley Astronomy Lecture Series.

Lick, the first continuously inhabited mountain-top observatory in the world, has been doing ground-breaking research since its opening in 1888. Thirty years after Lick Observatory established itself as

a leader in astronomical research, the 1918 Spanish Flu pandemic hit the United States. Research, while hampered by the conditions at the time, continued with the dedicated efforts of notable astronomers of the day.


Dr. Gates will highlight the hot topics of research that were being done in 1918 and how the observatory persevered through the difficult conditions at the time.
