Foothill College Associate in Arts Degree in Child and Adolescent Development for Transfer (Child and Adolescent Development AA-T)

Criteria A: Appropriate to Mission

1. Statement of Program Goals and Objectives

The Child Development Program's mission is to prepare students with the knowledge, theory, and practical experience necessary to plan, implement and evaluate developmentally appropriate experiences for young children and their families.

The Child and Adolescent Development AA-T program offers courses that prepare students for transfer to upper-division status at four-year educational institutions, as well as prepares them to work in the field of child development immediately. This program will prepare to students to transfer and pursue careers as early childhood educators, administrators of early childhood programs, and development specialists and could partially prepare them for careers in elementary education, social work, advocacy, special education, therapy, etc.

We have identified two Student Learning Outcomes that drive us as a department. They are:

- 1. Students who successfully complete a certificate or degree in Child Development will demonstrate understanding of the needs and characteristics of children birth through middle childhood and the multiple influences on their development as related to the high quality care and education of young children.
- 2. Students who successfully complete a certificate or degree in Child Development will demonstrate ethical standards and professional behaviors that deepen knowledge and commitment to the field of early care and education as related to NAEYC Code of Ethical Conduct.

2. Catalog Description

The Child and Adolescent Development Associate of Arts Transfer Degree (AA-T) is designed to prepare students to transfer to certain California State Universities (CSUs). Students who complete the Child and Adolescent Development AA-T will be ensured preferential transfer status to CSUs for Child Development/ Early Childhood Education majors. The AA-T Degree requirements will fulfill the lower division major requirements at many CSUs. Students are advised, however, to meet with a counselor to assess the course requirements for specific CSUs and to validate which CSUs are considered local.

4. Background and Rationale:

Students wishing to eventually receive Bachelor of Arts degrees in Child Development/ Early Childhood Education (among others) from a 4 year university, will be able to start with the Child and Adolescent Development AA-T at Foothill College and continue on to pursue that goal. This program will prepare students to transfer and pursue careers as early childhood educators, administrators of early childhood programs, and development specialists and could partially prepare them for careers in elementary education, special education, therapy, etc.. Additionally, students receiving a Bachelor of Arts in ECE/Child Development are eligible for the Master Teacher, Site Supervisor and Program Director levels of the CA Child Development Permit.

Criteria B: Need

6. Place of Program in Curriculum/Similar Programs

The AA-T in Child and Adolescent Development would be a unique addition to Foothill College. The degree is only offered at 6 other California Community Colleges, none of which are in our area. This degree articulates to a number of CSU programs including, but not limited to Child and Adolescent Development, Psychology, Family Studies, Human Development, Elementary Education, Applied Developmental Science, Early Childhood Education, and Humanities.
