Hello Foothill Family,

I just wanted to thank you all for your support this Fall soccer season!

I meant to send this earlier, but my wife and I left for our honeymoon a couple days after our Final Four game.

I could not be more proud of the group we had this year. In that last game the boys showed so much heart and never gave up. Even after being down 2 goals, they fought until the end and even scored the tying goal, that was called back for offside. (Unjustly, which was shown in the game film) That made it hurt a little more, but our team handled that adversity the same way they handle everything, with class.

After that magical season, which brought us 1 first team All American, 4 All-Region, and 11 All Conference players (and 1 coach of the year:). Many of our players are being recruited to 4 year schools. That is one of our top goals in this program, to help give these players a path to take their skills and educational opportunities to the next level.

We are playing Spring games against a handful of Universities as well. A fantastic opportunity for our boys to showcase themselves and our program to 4 year coaches.

We truly had a special team. By far one of the most diverse in the State. As I sat in the room at the Final Four banquet, I looked around at all the other teams and noticed that we had so much more diversity in our squad than them. Between those 3 teams, they had 10 State Championships in the past 13 years! We were in great company and represented our school well! What made us so different from the rest? Well for starters, we are the only team in the state with a 39 year old on our team, who has 2 kids, one of which our back up goalie actually coaches in youth soccer! Our goalkeeper, who was the best in the State, has had cancer twice and defied the odds to beat it and get back to playing the sport he loves. We had players from Japan, Italy, and Sweden. And then players from so many different socio-economic backgrounds. From living in Hillsborough to living in East Palo Alto and sleeping on his families couch and working til 3am to help pay his families rent. To see all these young men from so many different backgrounds come together and become a family is my favorite part about coaching. They sent me a picture of 10 of them up in Lake Tahoe in the snow a couple weeks back. Almost brought tears to my eyes to see that. They didn't know who each other were a few months ago, and now they are brothers. That is our program. It's truly a family!

Again, thank you all for the support and now it's time for me to build next years championship team!
