The bike facilities need to be drastically improved at Foothill College. Firstly, there is a lack of security, there are no security camera's, which might have contributed to the disappearance of my bike. The Foothill Police Department couldn't assist me, since there was no footage of the theft, and bike crime isn't considered a serious issue in California. Therefore no funds are allocated to tackle bike theft. Secondly, since my bike got stolen, i bought a new bike with a better lock, a U-lock. For my old bike I had a commonly used wire chain. The issue however is, that there is a shortage of "U-lock compatible" bike racks. At "U-lock compatible" bike racks cyclist can connect their bike frame with a U-lock to the bike rack. These kind of bike racks can mostly be found, at the far end of the campus, Lot 4A. By providing more U-lock compatible bike racks across campus, more cyclists can park their bike easily, which encourages bike usage. Lastly, since I am a part of the ASFC student government, I have heard about the plan to construct an expensive bike path around Foothill College. Even though, this might promote safety for cyclist, providing the last two mentioned options is far more valuable to cyclists. This feeling was confirmed by the Foothill Cycling Club.
